





Bain d'Aigues-Mortes



Carbone Tower, which served as a toll gate during the Middle Ages, dominates an extraordinary landscape and is accessible at all hours or day or night. Take the spiral staircase to the top for a breathtaking view. Surrounded by marshland and reed beds, entertain yourself by trying to spot the birds that blend into the background so they can feed and protect themselves (see page 16).

WALKING TOUR ITINERARY

The Tourist Office has devised a 90 minute tour (about 4 km) so you can stroll through town without missing a thing. Just follow our lead... and be sure to bring a camera!

As you exit the Tourist Office, turn around to face the building and look up to see the Aigues-Mortes coat of arms.

- 1. Aigues-Mortes coat of arms (6 April 1697 – Hozier):** It depicts Saint Martin, patron saint of the kings of France, sharing his cloak with a beggar.
- 2. Chapelle des Capucins:** The statue Saint Louis turns his back to this building, on your right as you face the Tourist Office. Capuchin monks built this chapel out of stones from the Peyrade breakwater, donated by King Louis XIV. It was dedicated to Saint Francis and then sold off by the State in 1791. In 1828, it was converted into a covered market.
- 3.** In the middle of Place Saint Louis, you will find a **statue of Saint Louis (1849)** overlooking the fountain. It was sculpted by James Pradier to commemorate the Crusades. The king stands against an anchor wearing his crown and coat of mail. The 3.25 metres tall statue tops a pedestal decorated with dolphins.
- 4.** Head towards Rue Jean Jaurès. At the start of that street, **Notre-Dame des Sablons Church (13th century)** will be on your right. The first church here, made of wood and reeds, dates back to 1183. In 1246, was rebuilt in a Gothic style, this time using stone. King Louis IX knelt there to pray in 1248, before setting out on a crusade. The 20th century stained glass windows were created by Claude Viallat and Bernard Dhonneur.
- 5. House at 2 rue Jean Jaurès (17th century):** Raise your head to the façade. The two visible sides of this house feature nine brackets decorated with female heads with tiaras and leaves, along with the remnants of large mullioned windows.
- 6. House at 19 rue Jean Jaurès (17th century):** Look up to see a house bedecked with Corinthian pilasters with acanthus leaves and a series of S-shaped brackets.
- 7. House at 26 rue Jean Jaurès (late 18th century):** This house at the end of the road features four keystones, with demi-relief sculptures of faces representing the four seasons on the front.
- 8.** Head towards Porte de la Gardette gate. On your right, in the middle of a small square, take a moment to admire the **fountain**. It was installed on 12 April 1896 to inaugurate the arrival of running potable water in Aigues-Mortes.
- 9. Porte de la Gardette:** For centuries, this gate was the only point of entry into the fortified town, guarded by a watch of soldiers.
- 10.** Step through Porte de la Gardette. Cross the street to the canal and walk left to the **Childhood of Bacchus statue** facing the water...

... It was sculpted by Ferdinand Faivre for the 1900 World's Fair. It was donated to the town in 1901. During the Second World War, the statue was melted down for use by the German army. It was later reconstructed by Patrick Granier using its original base.



11. Retrace your steps and go back through *Porte de la Gardette*. Continue to your right to *Place Anatole France* and admire **Constance Tower (13th century)** standing before you. It was built during the lifetime of King Louis IX, around 1242. It has served as a lighthouse, a residence and a prison with a tragic history.

12. Looking up and to your left, you can spot the tower's **bartizan**. This round, covered watch-turret was used to monitor the entrance to the Governor's House.

13. Turn left at the corner and you will see a vaulted building, formerly the **Governor's House (16th century)**. It was built by Governor de Civey in the place of the old royal residence which burnt down in the 15th century.

14. House at 22/24 Bd Intérieur Ouest (1679): Keep going and then turn left onto *Rue Amiral Courbet*. This house was purchased by the consuls for the garrison's officers. An inscription on its façade reads "Mare de Deu de Montserrat" (Our Lady of Montserrat).

15. Continue along *Bd Intérieur Ouest* to **Porte des Remblais** (Embankments Gate). Known as *Porte de Montpellier* up until the 18th century, it was rebaptized *Porte de Remblais* when the moat was filled.

16. Turn onto *Rue Sadi Carnot* to see the **house at 29 Bd Intérieur Ouest**. This former residence of the Lieutenant of the Realm was acquired by *Salins du Midi* in the 20th century. Its façade features a sculpture of a whale.

17. Bourguignons Tower: Keep walking down *Bd Intérieur Ouest* until you reach the tower at the far corner. In 1421, during the Armagnac-Burgundian Civil War, a garrison of Burgundians was massacred here. It was winter, so the ground was frozen. To prevent any risk of contagion, the bodies were piled and salted. After the thaw, they were removed from the tower and buried.

18. Walk down *Bd Intérieur Sud* and pass through **Porte de l'Organeau** (Anchor Ring Gate). Its name was inspired by the old port's anchorage. Formerly known as "Sewer Gate", it is now fitted with mooring rings.

Gargoyle: The primary purpose of gargoyles was to discharge water away from the walls. Gargoyles come in shapes inspired by animals, both real and imaginary. The one on *Porte de l'Organeau* is a griffon (part eagle and part lion) carrying a man away.

19. Porte des Moulins: The two windmills that gave this gate its name were raised and installed atop these two towers.



20. Porte des Galions: Its original name, *Porte de Portalet*, was changed to the current "Galleons Gate", in reference to it being a mooring point on the town's pond.

21. Porte de la Marine (Naval Gate): Galleys would moor alongside this gate. The mooring basin they used was called Psalmodi Pond.



22. Go through Porte de la Marine and walk straight down Bd Gambetta. On your right, you will see a **17th century house at number 35**. It is the only one with a portico whose roof is a floor. Its façade is pierced by mullioned windows.

23. Go back to Bd Intérieur Sud and turn left until you reach **Porte de l' Arsenal**. This gate owes its name to its proximity to Place de l' Arsenal.

24. Walk along the ramparts to **Poudrière Tower**. Initially called "Powder Tower", it was later renamed "Gunpowder Magazine Tower", for its location near the gunpowder and munitions depot.

25. Continue along Bd Intérieur Est to see **Porte de la Reine (Queen's Gate)**. It was through this gate that King Louis XIII and Anne of Austria entered Aigues-Mortes in 1622.

26. Gargoyles: Walk through Porte de la Reine and turn around to check out the gargoyles on the right tower: a lion crouched on all fours and others in the form of ferocious dogs. These sculptures reflect the taste that dominated the reign (1285-1314) of King Philip the Fair, the final builder of these city walls.

27. Turn around and walk straight onto Chemin Bas de Peccais. On your left, you will come across an **ice house (last of the three recorded in the 17th century)**. Back in the day, it was covered with earth to keep it cool. In its centre is a well.

28. Méjeanet Cross (1838): Go a little farther along Chemin Bas de Peccais, to the entrance to Mas de Méjeanet on your right. This cross belongs to the prior of the White Penitents (L. Méjean) and was installed at the time of his appointment.

29. Bérénice Cross (1852): Retrace your steps. turn right before Porte de la Reine and walk on to Villeneuve Tower. Turn right on Bd Diderot and then go straight to the roundabout at Rue Bérénice. This cross belongs to the prior of the Grey Penitents (L. Bachain) and was installed at the time of his appointment.

30. Go back the way you came to **Villeneuve Tower**, at the northeast corner of the ramparts. This tower was the first one built. It was first called "Masks Tower" before being that was changed to the name of General Romieu de Villeneuve, a close associate of King Louis IX.

31. Go back to **Porte des Cordeliers (Franciscans Gate)**. Upon his return from the Seventh Crusade in 1255, King Louis IX founded a Franciscan monastery between this gate and Place de la Vigerie. After being destroyed in 1575 during the Wars of Religion, it was rebuilt in the 17th century and then sold to a local resident in 1778.

32. Go through the gate and turn right on Bd Intérieur Est. At the corner, continue onto Bd Intérieur Nord. Farther down on your right, you will see **Mèche Tower**. A fuse (mèche) was kept lit at all times, ready to set fire to the gunpowder in case of danger.

33. Continue along the wall to **Porte Saint Antoine**, a gate named after a nearby cemetery. Check out the three sculptures: a centauress, a dragon and a centaur. The centauress seems to have been designed to carry statues that have since disappeared.



Historical and Archaeological Society: Porte Saint Antoine contains many relics of the past, uncovered in the surrounding area.

34. Farther down, the **Salt Tower** was originally used as a salt depot. Because it served as a prison in the 12th and 13th centuries, it is also known as “Military Prison Tower”.

35. Turn left onto Rue Alsace Lorraine and then take the first left. Look at the **house at 5 Rue de la République (19th century)**. Sculpted lions keep watch from the balcony.

36. Make your way down the street. Stop in front of the **house at 30 Rue de la République (19th century)**. Its façade bears the crest of the former owner’s guild (makers of chain mail).



37. At the corner of Rue Louis Blanc and Rue de la République, you will find the **White Penitents’ Chapel (17th century)**, which belongs to the Confraternity of White Penitents and is home to a listed fresco by Xavier Sigalon and paintings by Auguste-Barthélemy Glaize.

38. **House at 6 place de la Viguerie:** At the far end of Rue de la République, cross Bd Gambetta to Place de la Viguerie. With the square on your left, the house will be on your right, across from the post office. See the remnants of its immense mullioned window.

39. Walk on a short ways to the **Grey Penitents’ Chapel (17th century)**. It belongs to the Confraternity of Grey Penitents and features a listed stucco altarpiece made by Jean Sabatier.

40. In the chapel garden, you can see the **Cross of the Five Wounds**. This ancient cross was inaugurated in 1814 on Place Saint Louis, where the statue of Saint Louis now stands. It was moved to its current location in 1825.



41. As you exit the chapel, take the street perpendicular to Place de la Viguerie in the direction of Porte de l’Arsenal. Take the first right onto Rue Roger Salengro. Keep going until it turns into Rue Emile Jamais. On your left, look at the **house at 48 rue Emile Jamais (19th century)**. A balcony supported by acanthus leaves frames the doorway.

42. Stroll down Rue Emile Jamais to Place Saint Louis. At the corner, on your right, is the **Town Hall (1535)**. A consular administration building was initially erected in 1279, replaced in 1535 by the newly built Town Hall, which also housed the prison. The building soon became too small and dilapidated. So, the consuls purchased the western corner and expanded the property. The interior staircase dates from 1772, and the façade was redone during the 19th century.

Faun head: Look up and to the right, at the cornice on the corner of Town Hall. This mask dates from the 17th century, from the time when the edifice was rebuilt.

Now you know everything there is to know about Aigues-Mortes and its ramparts!

2,000 YEARS OF HISTORY IN AIGUES-MORTES

ORIGINS

Humans have always occupied Aigues-Mortes. **If you have the chance head to the northeast and, if it's open, step inside Porte Saint Antoine, where you will receive a warm welcome from one of the member of the local Historical and Archaeological Society.**

Inside this gate, a large number of relics from all eras are on display – bones, tools, pottery, coins and more – from early man to the 20th century (variable hours, see the Tourist Office for current information).

ANTIQUITY

In the countryside, 10 kilometres east of town, are the ruins of Fort Peccais. In ancient times, a Greek colony settled there, followed by the Romans in the 1st century, who even then began producing and harvesting salt.

During the Second World War, its strategic location did not escape the German forces, who built concrete bunkers there, which all self-respecting Aigues-Mortes natives have explored at one point or another. The region got its name from the Roman engineer Peccius.

The fort was built in 1568, in a region that had been subjected to religious upheaval since 1560, to guarantee continuous control over the neighbouring salt marshes and the canals on which the salt was transported. It is reminiscent of Vauban's fortifications, although that engineer would only be born much later (1633-1707). The fort is currently closed to the public. It is scheduled to be restored in the coming years. Far from any sources of visual pollution, at the edge of the salt marsh, this is a place that exudes tranquillity.

MIDDLE AGES

Benedictine monks moved here in the 5th century, amidst marshes and ponds in a hostile environment, where they founded an **abbey**. Those monks were devoted to Opus Dei, and their incessant chanting, both day and night, earned their community the nickname of **Psalmody or Psalmodi**. The remains of the abbey are located on a private property that is closed to the general public.

[DID YOU KNOW?]

Some 13th century writings called this place as ***Aquae Mortuae***, referring to the “dead waters” of the ponds and marshes that surround it. It is connected to the sea by the Viel Canal, along which flat-bottomed barges were pulled by horses from the banks.

Aigues-Mortes owes its name to these “dead” (stagnant) waters all around it! Contrary to popular belief, the sea never battered against its ramparts.

LOUIS IX IN AIGUES-MORTES

In the 13th century, King Louis IX owned no land along the Mediterranean. He wanted to capitalize on this landlocked port, surrounded by rival ports that were monopolizing river traffic in the region.

Agde and Saint Gilles belonged to Raymond VII, Marseille was the property of Charles of Anjou, and Montpellier was the domain of the King of Aragon. This region of stagnant waters was the only one that was negotiable. It was, in fact, the perfect place to establish an inland port and develop trade with the West. It was located in the Kingdom of France and was connected to the sea by the Viel Canal (to the west of town, now dried up).

However, the surrounding land and ponds belonged to Psalmody Abbey. At the request of Louis IX, the Benedictines agreed to trade the territory of Aigues-Mortes for vast farmland

belonging to the Crown in the Sommières region.

A short while later, King Louis fell seriously ill. He miraculously escaped death and pledged to liberate Christ's tomb, which the heathens had reconquered. He decided that the crusade would be a French one and would depart from a French port.



CONSTRUCTION OF A TOWN AND A ROYAL PORT

In 1244, the architect Eudes de Montreuil drew up the first plans for the inland port and the town. In spite of challenging sanitary and climate conditions, the area was inhabited by a sparse population of fisherfolk and salt harvesters living in huts made of reeds.

The alluvial territory of Aigues-Mortes had no stones, so they were brought in from quarries in Beaucaire and Les Baux by river. The village was built from the ground up, in a region with no organized town planning.



It was established between the second and third sandbars, in close proximity to Murette Pond and to town.

For four years, the entire region was occupied by this immense project, the construction of a town and a royal port. Conflict broke out all over, leading to mutinies. The king imposed statute labour on entire regions, as far as Alès and beyond.

As a compromise, he offered to waive all tolls and taxes, including land and salt taxes, to anyone who continued to work.

In early July 1244, Louis IX settled in Aigues-Mortes, amongst the troops of crusaders that were arriving daily. He was accompanied by his wife Margaret of Provence and his brothers Robert of Artois and Charles of Anjou, and later joined by all the great lords and barons of France.

SEVENTH CRUSADE AND CONSTANCE TOWER

In 1248, there was still no town of Aigues-Mortes, only its ports. More than 700 boats loaded provisions, horses and men-at-arms, protected from the violence of surging waters.

The first two storeys of a big main tower, the Grosse Forte Tour, were built. It was later called “King’s Tower” and then “Constance Tower” and was, at the time, the future fortified town’s only defensive element. Its system of defence was designed to withstand any assault. Nowadays, you discover this fascinating place on a guided tour. As mentioned before, the ground at Aigues-Mortes is spongy. Pile foundations had to descend to a depth of 20 metres. The beacon was not yet installed on the tower, but there were plans to do so. The tower was completed in 1250. Today, the beacon is

no longer accessible, for safety reasons.

The terrace on top, 33 metres in the air, provides panoramic views which, on the clearest days, can extend as far as the mountaintops of the Pic Saint Loup and Mont Ventoux.



EIGHTH CRUSADE

Twenty years later, in 1270, Louis IX set off on his second crusade and died of typhus shortly thereafter, off the coast of Tunis, on 25 August 1270. At the time of his death, the ramparts’ foundations had only been partly mapped out. His son Philip III the Bold and his grandson Philip IV the Fair took over the work and completed it towards the end of the 13th century. A road was also built

through the marshes to connect the town to Carbonnière Tower, which was a toll gate and the only land-based point of entry to the port at Aigues-Mortes.

Each year, on the next to last weekend in August, Aigues-Mortes dons all its mediaeval finery to plunge us into the heart of the Middle Ages.



CARBONNIÈRE TOWER

Built in the late 13th century, as the guardian of the fortified town, Carbonnière Tower stands majestic and solitary in the midst of the marshes. It was the only point of entry into the town of Aigues-Mortes by land. It was impossible for travellers to bypass, as the carriageway went right through its gate thrown open to the four winds.

[HOW WAS AIGUES-MORTES POPULATED?]

To populate this new town with its harsh climate and no agricultural resources, Louis IX granted it a customs charter in 1246. The charter exempted residents from tolls and from port and other taxes. The town then enjoyed an influx of people from Catalonia, Provence and

Italy. The customs charter was confirmed by the king's son Philip III the Bold and by 14 of his successors. Thanks to those privileges, the town imagined by Louis IX was able to survive after the decline of its port.

BLUE BELLIES AND THE HUNDRED YEARS' WAR

Aigues-Mortes was a military target. From the top of its ramparts, soldiers would take it in turns to sound the alarm about the Saracen threat during the Hundred Years' War and against Spanish assailants in the 16th century.

In 1481, the Port of Marseille belonged to the Kingdom of France, and alluvia from the Rhône, plus the silting and clogging of outlets to the sea precipitated the failure of the port in Aigues-Mortes.

In the early 15th century, France was torn apart by a civil war between the Armagnacs and the Burgundians. Governor Louis de Malpüe betrayed the town by handing it over to the Burgundians.

Some of the inhabitants fled and alerted the Armagnacs, then stationed in Beaucaire. With the collusion of the residents who had stayed behind, the Armagnacs entered the town and slaughtered all the Burgundians.

It was winter, so the ground was frozen and the

bodies could not be buried. To stave off any risk of contagion, the corpses were salted and tossed into a tower that has since been known as the "Burgundian Tower".

At the end of winter, the bodies were removed and buried. As a result of the salt that prevented putrefaction, the Burgundians' abdomens had turned blue. **This is one of the explanations why the people of Aigues-Mortes are known as "Blue Bellies"!**



WARS OF RELIGION

In 1575, a large number of Protestants sacked Aigues-Mortes. They ransacked, pillaged and burned all Catholic monuments. The Protestants' control of the town came to an end in 1622, under the reign of Louis XIII.

In 1685, following the revocation of the Edict of Nantes, the Huguenots were persecuted once again.



PRISON TOWER

For 82 years, at the orders of the royal authorities, Constance Tower was used to lock up the victims of religious and State intolerance.

The tower was just one of the kingdom's many sinister prisons that were the sites of such horror. Their exact number remains unknown, as there were no prison registers to keep track of them. In the first years following the revocation of the Edict of Nantes, the prison inside Constance Tower and the Queen's Gate – the largest within the town's walls – were stops along the way to deportation to the West Indies or sentencing to the galleys.

Anne Gausset died there in 1763, at the age of 85, after 40 years of incarceration. Marie Robert spent 41 years there. The last woman, Jeanne Darbon,

was imprisoned in 1761. Minister of State Florentin held onto the prison as long as he could, slowly releasing the women whose plight was attracting more and more pity.

Thanks to the efforts of Provincial Commander Fitz-James and to the persistent and generous intervention of the Prince of Beauvau, who was also President of the Estates of Languedoc, the prisoners “nearly all of whose health had deteriorated” were gradually freed. Fourteen women were still detained there in the middle of 1766. Two years later, there were six left. On 27 December 1768, the doors were unceremoniously opened to the last two captives, Marie Roux and Suzanne Pagès, after 23 and 27 years of imprisonment.

MALE PRISONERS IN THE TOWER

The room at the top of Constance Tower, assigned to men, was at first reserved for high-ranking prisoners. The lower room – and also the most hostile – housed only women for a long time. Female prisoners would later go on to occupy the upper room, or even both when justified by their numbers.

The most amazing prison break was the one led by a Camisard leader, Abraham Mazel, in 1705.

In 1708, a court ruling designated Constance Tower as a permanent detention centre for women. From 1715 onwards, women were the only prisoners there. The detainees were of all ages and all statuses.

One of the best-known prisoners was also one of the most resolute: Marie Durand (see below).

[MARIE DURAND]

Marie Durand was the physical embodiment of thoughtful resistance and the triumphant resignation of female prisoners. She was born in the Vivarais region and grew up in a harsh land.

Her father was arrested in 1729. Her brother, a prominent, peaceful “pastor of the desert” was hung in 1732. He had gained such authority that a 15-year-old Marie was arrested in 1730. “The mere name of the girl”, wrote the

provincial intendant, “demanded that we make an example of her”. She wasn't released until 1768. In the prison, she inspired resistance. Legend has it – rightly or wrongly, it's impossible to say – that she carved the word **REGISTER** (Occitan for “resist”) into the rim of the oubliette in the upper room. Marie Durand spent 38 years sustaining her sisters in captivity.

REGISTER

FRENCH REVOLUTION

The population of Aigues-Mortes eagerly greeted the dawn of the French Revolution. **The residents formed popular societies, surveillance committees, revolutionary *sans-culottes* clubs.** Soon though, spurred on by fierce political passions, regrettable incidents took place in the town, some of which ended in tragedy. The population joyously cheered at the storming of the Bastille. But alarming news began to circulate soon after. It was said that godless individuals and armed gangs were roaming through the countryside, laying waste to everything in their path.

A law issued on 17 December 1789 reorganized municipalities, replaced consuls by a mayor and five municipal officers voted into office by active citizens. **The first mayor and municipal officers of Aigues-Mortes were elected on 2 February 1790.**

On the eve of the French Revolution, the entire population of Aigues-Mortes was Catholic. When National Assembly issued a decree on 27 November 1790, on the civil constitution of the clergy, the residents of Aigues-Mortes, who were deeply devoted to their religious beliefs, saw this as a threat to their old traditions.

The decree of 27 November 1790 outlawed all religious congregations. Refractory priests who refused the oath of constitutional clergy took the path of self-exile. In September 1792, more than 100 of them set sail from Aigues-Mortes for destinations abroad. All the crosses in the region were inverted and, in the name of the entire municipality, the decision was made to renounce religion for good.

The parish church was converted, first into a barracks and then into a Decadary temple.

When you enter the church, you can see the traces of chimneys embedded in the stone wall on your left, marking the place where the kitchens were once set up.


The chapel of the White Penitents became the headquarters for the Society of **Sans-culottes**. The Grey Penitents' chapel became the garrison cavalry's fodder stores. Thanks to a clever initiative taken by the citizen Jean Sol, appointed guard and distributor of fodder by the revolutionaries, he was able to salvage the chapel's famous altarpiece, a 17th century masterpiece from the sculptor Jean Sabatier. Jean Sol hid the altarpiece behind bales of hay, which is what inspired the revolutionaries to use the space as storage for fodder.



In the early 19th century, freedom of religion was restored, the churches were returned to the faithful and religious peace was assured.

The canal between the Rhône and Sète was completed in 1806, at which point Aigues-Mortes became a river port through which goods and then passengers travelled. **In 1903, the ramparts of Aigues-Mortes became a listed Historic Monument.**

GRANDMA'S RECIPES

ROUILLE



- 5 kg octopus
- 2.5 kg potatoes
- 1.2 kg aioli
- 5 chili peppers
- 3 bay leaves
- Salt, pepper and saffron

Preparation:

After cleaning the octopus, bring a pot of lightly salted water to a boil and cook the octopus with the chilli peppers, the bay leaves and a dash of saffron for 45 to 50 minutes. During that time, peel the potatoes and chop them into large cubes.

Make an aioli (with oil, eggs, garlic, salt, pepper and saffron) and set aside.

When the octopus is tender (once a knife can slide in easily), remove it from the pot but keep the water. Boil the potatoes in the same water for about 20 minutes.

Cut the octopus into rough chunks. Drain the potatoes.

Delicately assemble the octopus, potatoes and aioli.

Season with salt and pepper to taste, as needed, and serve warm.

GARDIANE DE TAUREAU



- 1 kg AOC Camargue bull meat
- 2 bay leaves
- 2sprigs of thyme
- 1 piece of dried orange peel
- Salt, pepper, vinegar and olive oil
- 300 g onions
- 1 bottle of good red wine
- 1 garlic clove

Preparation of the marinade:

The day before, cut the meat into cubes and chop the onions, then cover it all with red wine.

Add a drizzle of vinegar, the thyme, the bruised bay leaves and the orange peel, and marinate in the refrigerator overnight.

Preparation of the gardiane:

Drain the meat and brown it in olive oil in a pan.

Run the marinade through a conical strainer and then use it to deglaze the hot pan.

Pour over the meat in a casserole dish.

Add the raw onions, type, bay leaves and orange peel from the marinade, plus the salt, pepper and crushed garlic clove.

Simmer for 3 hours, checking to make sure the sauce does not reduce too much.

Serve hot, accompanied by Camargue rice.
